


Political Science Alumni Outcomes: 1996-2007

So far, sixty-seven percent of the Political Science alumni have gone on to attend graduate or professional schools.

Ninety-seven percent of the alumni were employed or pursuing education at the time of completing the survey.


Graduate/Professional Education (N=57)

■ No Response


Twenty-seven out of 38 alumni (71%) who attended graduate/professional schools received some type of graduate financial support.

Graduate/Professional Schools Financial Support* (N=38)




Most Political Science alumni report being employed in the professional, government, and education fields.

Employment Fields (N=41)




Employment/Pursuing Education Status (N=57)




Of alumni who attended graduate/professional schools, 50% (19/38) earned advanced degrees so far. Thirteen degrees (34%) were in progress.

- 2) 128 New College alumni graduated during the 1996-2007 period with Areas of Concentration in Political Science. Fifty-seven provided information, a 45% response rate overall.
- 3) Includes graduates with the following areas of concentration: Political Science, International and Area Studies, International Studies, Latin American Studies.
- 4) *Based on the number of students who attended graduate/professional schools. (alumni could make multiple selections, or not answer the question.)
- 5) **Only the highest earned degree (unduplicated headcount) is reported. Regarding degrees in progress, duplicated headcount is reported, as alumni can pursue more than one degree simultaneously. The number of degrees in progress may not match the number reported in other charts due to missing degree data.
