



## Alumni Outcomes: 1996-2007

So far, seventy-nine percent of the Classics alumni have gone on to attend graduate or professional schools.

All of the alumni were employed or pursuing education at the time of completing the survey.


#### Graduate/Professional Education (N=14)

■ Did Not Attend


Ten out of eleven alumni (91%) who attended graduate/professional schools received some type of graduate financial support.

### Graduate/Professional Schools Financial Support\* (N=11)




Many Classics alumni report being employed in the education field.

Employment/Pursuing Education Status (N=14)




■ Employed

Of alumni who attended graduate/professional schools, 64% (7/11) earned advanced degrees so far. Five degrees (45%) were in progress.
