


### **General Studies** Alumni Outcomes: 1996-2007

So far, fifty-eight percent of the General studies alumni have gone on to attend graduate or professional schools. Ninety-six percent of the alumni were employed or pursuing education at the time of completing the survev.

**Employment/Pursuing Education Status** 



Eight out of 14 alumni (57%) who attended graduate/professional schools received some type of graduate financial support.


Of alumni who attended graduate/professional schools, 71% (10/14) earned advanced degrees so far. Five degrees (36%) were in progress.

#### **Graduate/Professional Schools Financial** Support\* (N=14)




Most General Studies alumni report being employed in education, hospitality, and professional fields.

## **Highest Level of Advanced Degree**




Most alumni careers are related to the Area of Concentration (AOC) at New College.
