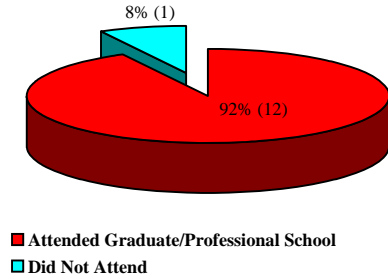


# Art History Alumni Outcomes: 1996-2007

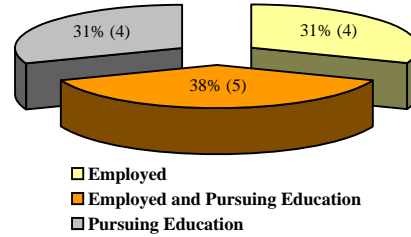
*So far, ninety-two percent of the Art History alumni have gone on to attend graduate or professional schools.*

**Graduate/Professional Education (N=13)**



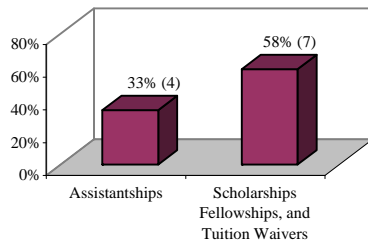
*All of the alumni were employed or pursuing education at the time of completing the survey.*

**Employment /Pursuing Education Status (N=13)**



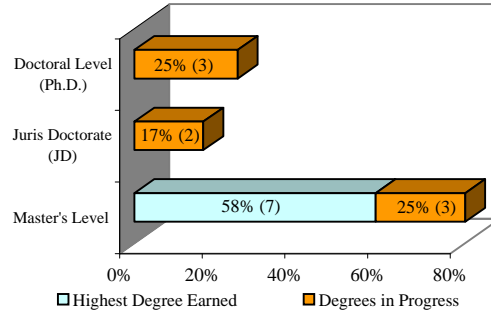
*Seven out of 12 alumni (58%) who attended graduate/professional schools received some type of graduate financial support.*

**Graduate/Professional Schools Financial Support\* (N=12)**



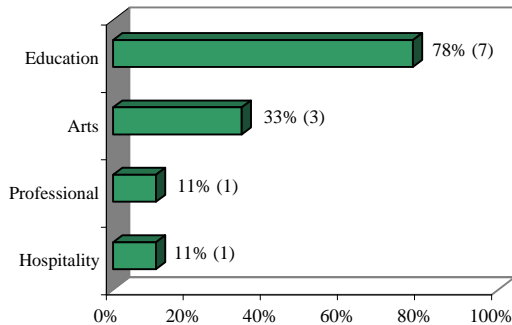
*Of alumni who attended graduate/professional schools, 58% (7/12) earned advanced degrees so far. Eight degrees (67%) were in progress.*

**Highest Level of Advanced Degree Earned / Degrees in Progress (N=12)\*\***



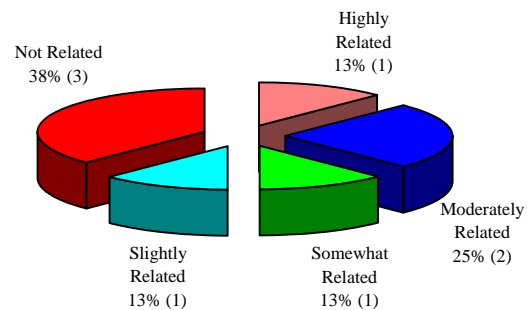
*Most Art History alumni report being employed in education and the arts fields.*
